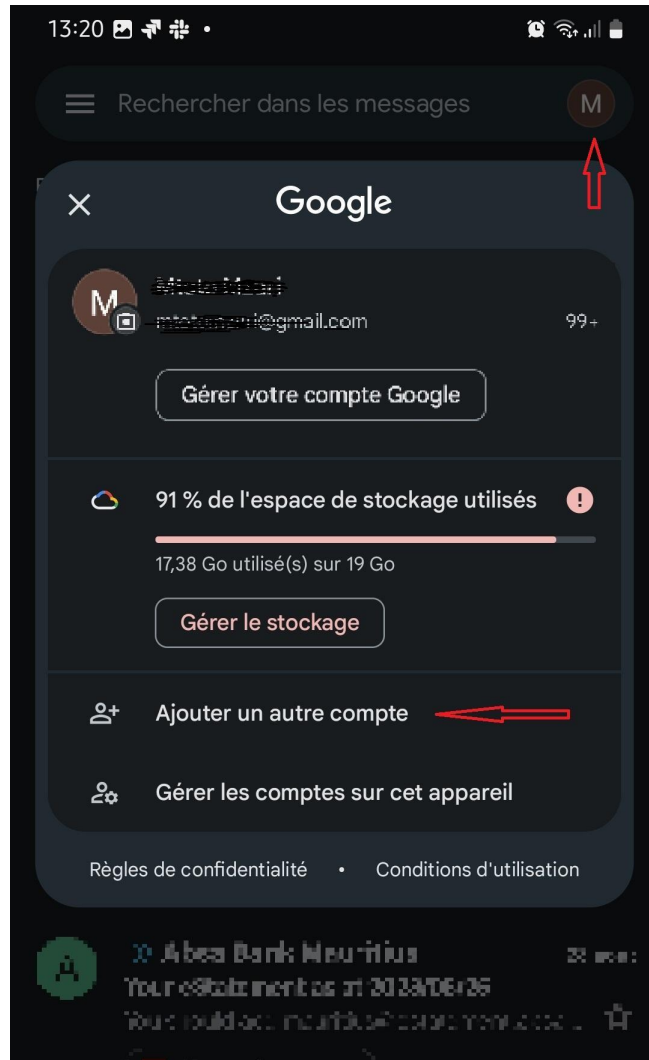


1st step

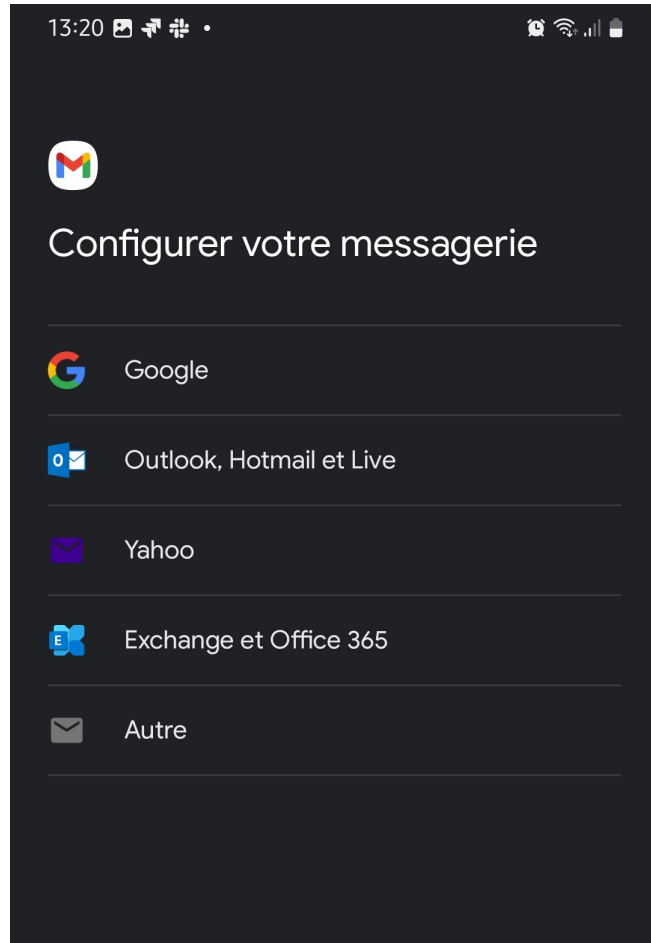

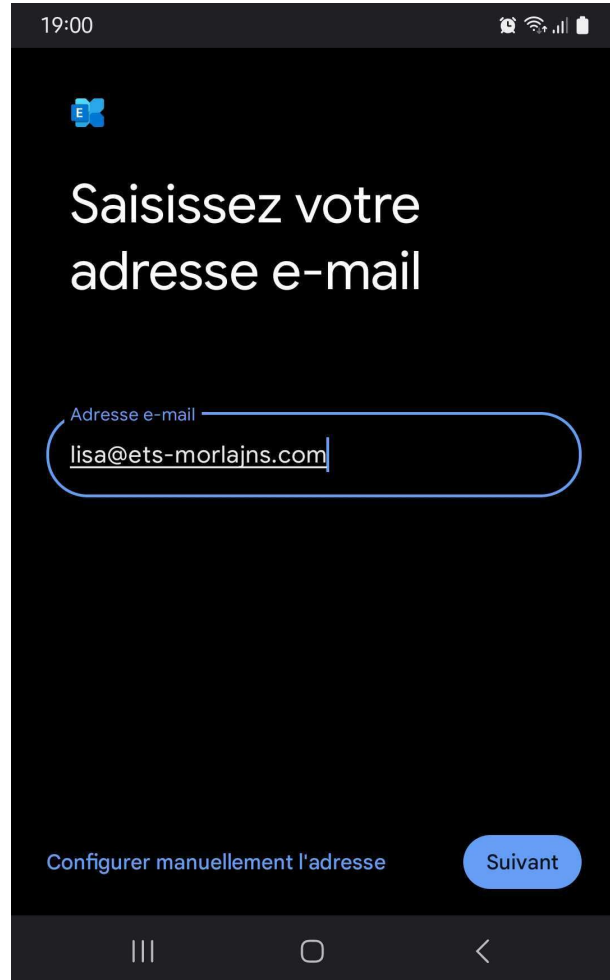

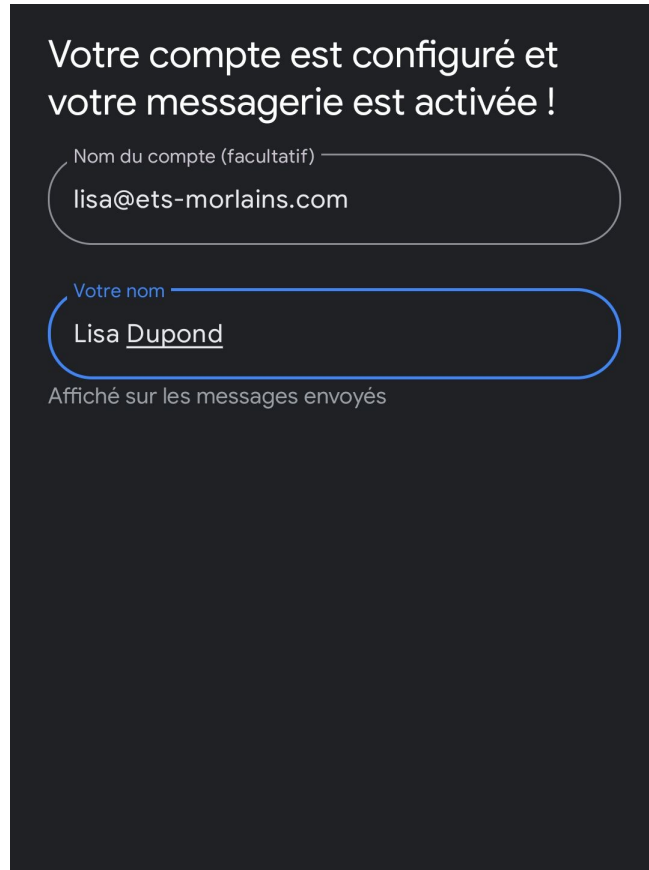
